## Dear Parent/Carer.

## BCG vaccination for children in Reception and Year 1

In the UK, like many other countries, the BCG vaccine is offered to babies and children who are more likely than the general population to have contact with someone with Tuberculosis (TB). Eligible babies & young children are usually identified by the midwife or health visitor in pregnancy or birth, you can check to see if your child has had their BCG vaccination in their red book.

Please ignore this letter if your child has already had this vaccination.

The BCG vaccination is the most effective way of protecting your child against serious forms of TB (Tuberculosis) such as TB meningitis. BCG vaccine for tuberculosis (TB) overview - NHS (www.nhs.uk)

Please Note: The BCG vaccine is NOT routinely offered to all children – it only applies to children under 16 years of age - who are thought to have an increased risk of contact with the TB virus.

## Does my child need a BCG Vaccination?

If your child is under 16yrs and you answered 'Yes' to any of the following questions, your child is eligible to have a BCG vaccination if he or she hasn't already had one.

- Any parents or grandparents, born in a country with a high rate of TB (see the list below)
- Are you and your child planning to live or to stay with friends and family in one of these high-risk countries for a prolonged period? (for at least 3 months)?
- Does anyone who lives with your child, or who spends a lot of time with your child, have TB now or had TB in the recent past?
